FXA Customer Training Course Outline

Objective

The objective of the Iridesse Production Press and connected Raster Image Processor (RIP) training course is to provide participants with comprehensive training to ensure that key operators have the appropriate skills to maximise the productivity, quality and longevity of their Fuji Xerox digital printing solution.

Course Overview

The Iridesse Production Press customer training course will cover fundamental skills required for customers to commence immediate and efficient production on the Fuji Xerox solution.

In order for a successful implementation, each Iridesse Production Press sale will include ONE training session of 3 days x up to 2 operators, plus an optional 1 day Specialty Dry Ink (SDI) for Graphic Designer/Digital PrePress.

Who Should Attend

Key Operators and Backup Operators of the Iridesse Production Press as well as graphic content creators eg Graphic Designers/PrePress Operators. Business Owners may also benefit from areas of the course.

This course is aimed at trainees that can demonstrate strong PC or MAC skills and whom have a basic understanding of digital printing. Fuji Xerox training specialist may recommend pre-courseware or external courses as a pre-requisite to the Iridesse Production Press training.

Course Duration

Iridesse Production Press customer training is 3 days plus 1 day optional SDI and has been structured into a training package consisting of:

- 3 days – onsite at customer's premises, following Iridesse install, or offsite at a Fuji Xerox branch, where applicable.
- 1 day – offsite at a Fuji Xerox branch, optional

Delivery Method

- The training session will be delivered using a combination of verbal and written instruction as well as demonstration by the Fuji Xerox instructor.
- Practical exercises combined with interactive discussion with participants to gain feedback on the level of understanding. Participants will have the opportunity of hands-on interacting directly with their Fuji Xerox solution.
- Hard copy printouts and soft copy files will be supplied to support information delivered by the Fuji Xerox instructor.

Course Code

GCSCSOFTDLY is \$1600 + gst per day x 3 days onsite + optional 1 day offsite for Specialty Dry Ink (SDI)

- For new Iridesse installs, customers have up to 90 days to utilize complementary training included in purchased/leased solution

- on customer site or Fuji Xerox site, if required

Iridesse Production Press



3 days – Onsite

Conducted by Fuji Xerox Australia training specialists on customer site, the modules covered include Press operation procedures, daily maintenance and precautions. Trainee will also be taught how to control and manage your digital document workflow to maximise the productivity and benefits of your Fuji Xerox solution. Training is designed to enable operators to commence production on the Iridesse Production Press engine immediately upon install.

Basic modules include:

- Understanding customer requirements
- Iridesse Production Press Engine Overview
- Specialty Dry Ink swap procedure
- Printer Control User Interface (PCUI)
- External Raster Image Processor (RIP) features:
 - Job Submission
 - Managing Jobs
 - Job Imposition and Layout
 - Job Finishing/Output
 - Basic Image Quality
 - Basic Colour Management
 - Specialty Dry Ink
- Workflows including Templates, Drivers and Hot folders
- Online Support

Optional 1 day – Specialty Dry Ink (offsite)

Optional Day 4 **SDI** training consists of file preparation for Specialty Dry Inks and is aimed at graphic content creators eg. Graphic Designer/Digital PrePress Operators). Students need to have a basic to intermediate experience in using the Adobe Creative Suite applications eg InDesign, Photoshop, Illustrator, Acrobat Pro.

Day 4 (Optional for Graphic Designer/Digital PrePress)

- Properties of Specialty Dry Inks (SDI)
- Considerations when producing artwork containing SDI
- How to use the Adobe Creative Suite to produce Spot Color objects in a variety of ways for SDI
- Adobe settings to create and analyse press-ready PDFs
